Her dam is Joylan Durham Glora (2E-93, EX-97-dairy strength), the Supreme Interbreed Champion Dairy Event 2004 who has produced over 30,000M and 3.5 in her best lactation. She is also the dam of Joylan Eurostar at Cogent and Smiddiehill Granite at Genus ABS.
